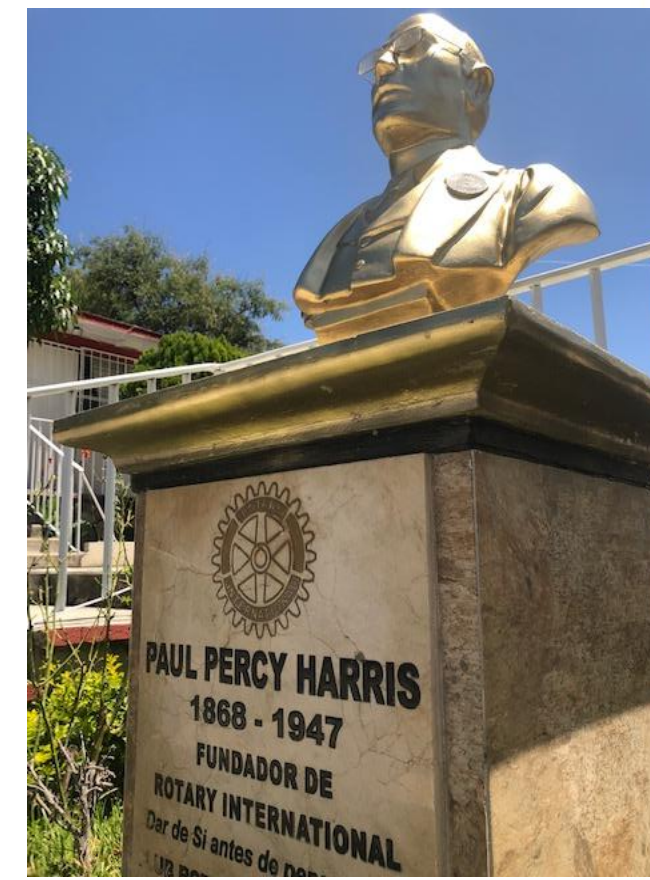

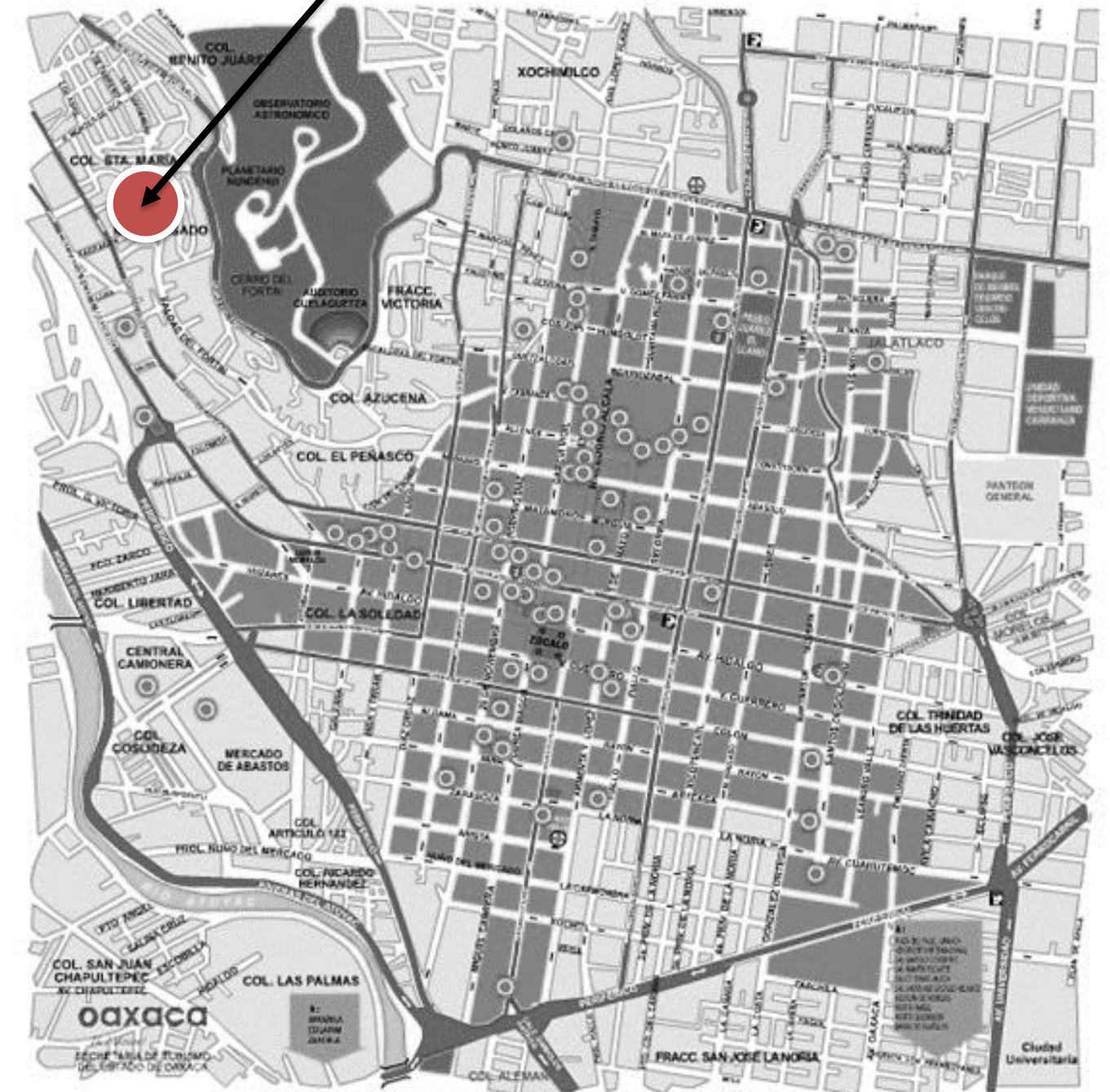

Where is Oaxaca?

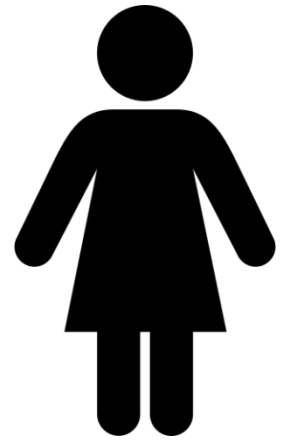

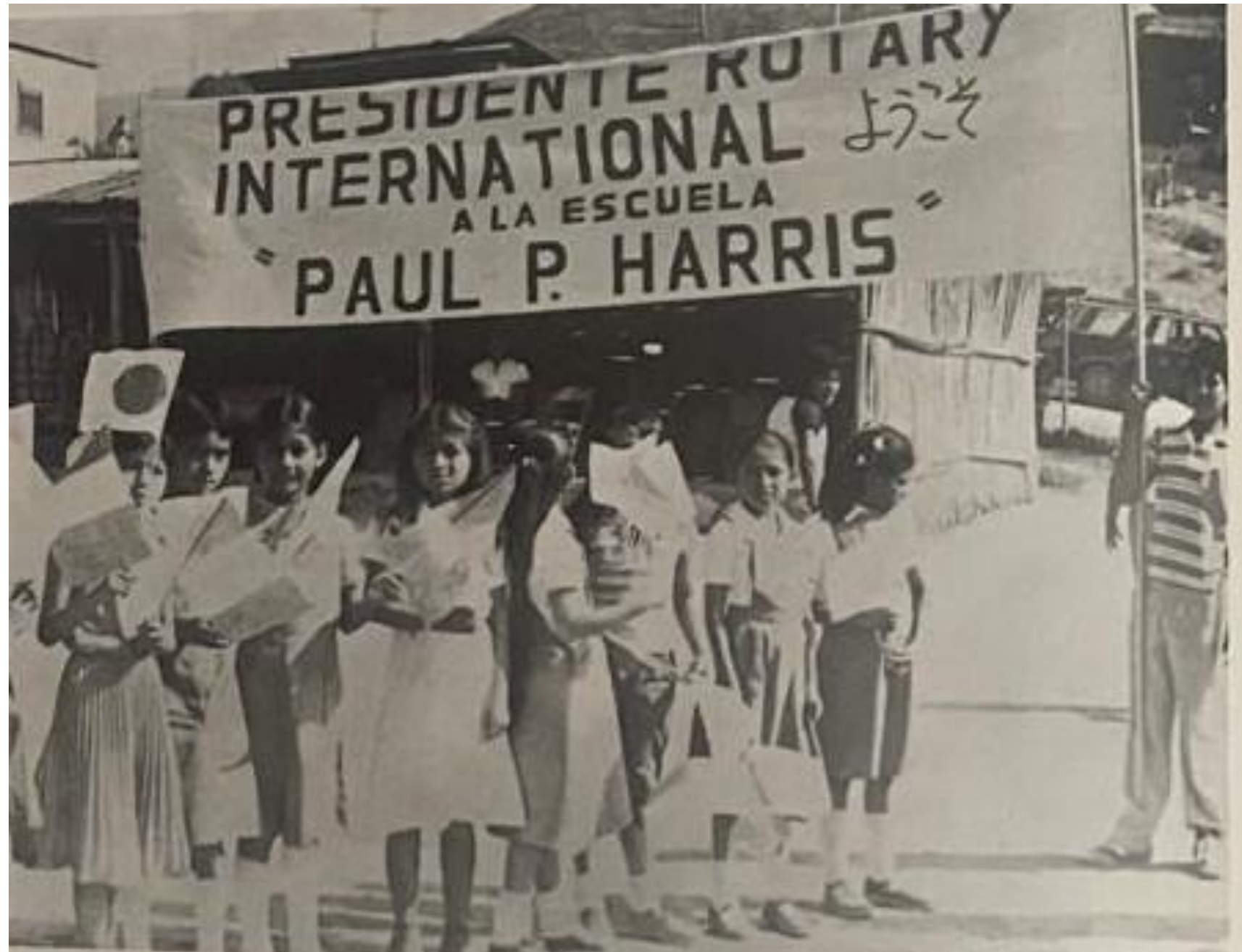


BACKGROUND

Forty-five years after the founding of the Paul Percy Harris School in Oaxaca, Mexico, the campus has been gradually transformed through the support of local Rotary clubs, improving the educational conditions for the young students who attend this institution. One of the fundamental aspects of education is its connection to sports and multipurpose development, which is why this project seeks to improve the living and functional conditions of this school—an institution that has historically been founded, supported, and built by several generations of Rotarians, beginning with its establishment by Rotary International World President Hiroji Mukasa of Japan. Next April, the current RI President, Francesco Arezzo, will visit the school.



BACKGROUND



PROBLEMS

In 2015, with the support of the Rotary Club of Oaxaca, a roof structure was built over the sports area, covering 450 m², providing better use of the space and greater safety for the students of the institute.

However, the surface is currently deteriorated due to the passage of time and the basic materials with which it was originally built, making it necessary to install a new platform that will allow users to carry out their daily sports and cultural activities in the best possible way, making full use of this space.

Meanwhile, the multipurpose area, kitchen, and dining room do not have the necessary equipment for proper operation.

Due to these circumstances, it has not been feasible to implement activities aimed at fostering unity among parents, students, and teachers.



CURRENT STATUS



POSITIVE PEACE

Positive peace is a concept that goes beyond the absence of direct violence and focuses on the attitudes, institutions, and structures that create and sustain peaceful and prosperous societies. It is based on the idea that lasting peace is built through equity, social justice, development, respect for rights, low corruption, and effective governance. Unlike negative peace (the absence of war), positive peace is a state of human flourishing where people's potential can reach its highest level.

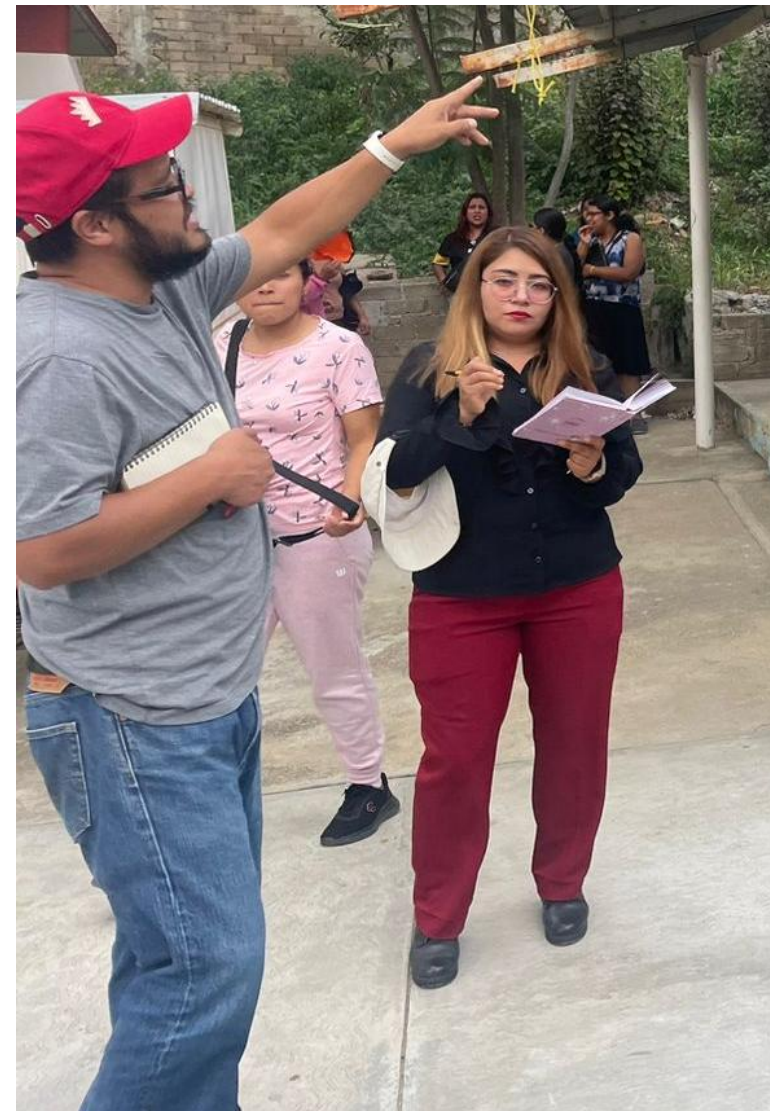
PROJECT'S OBJETIVE

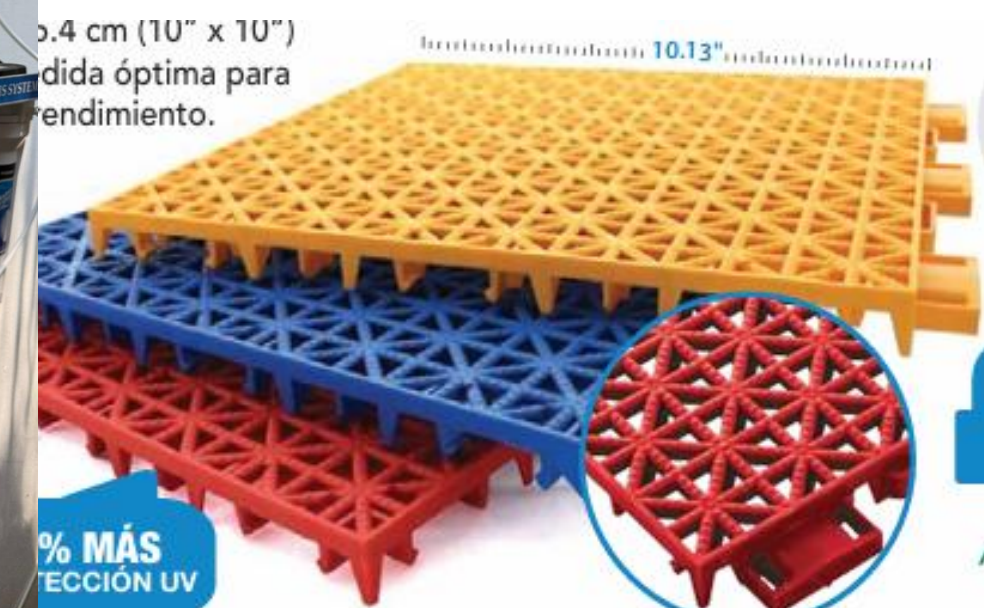

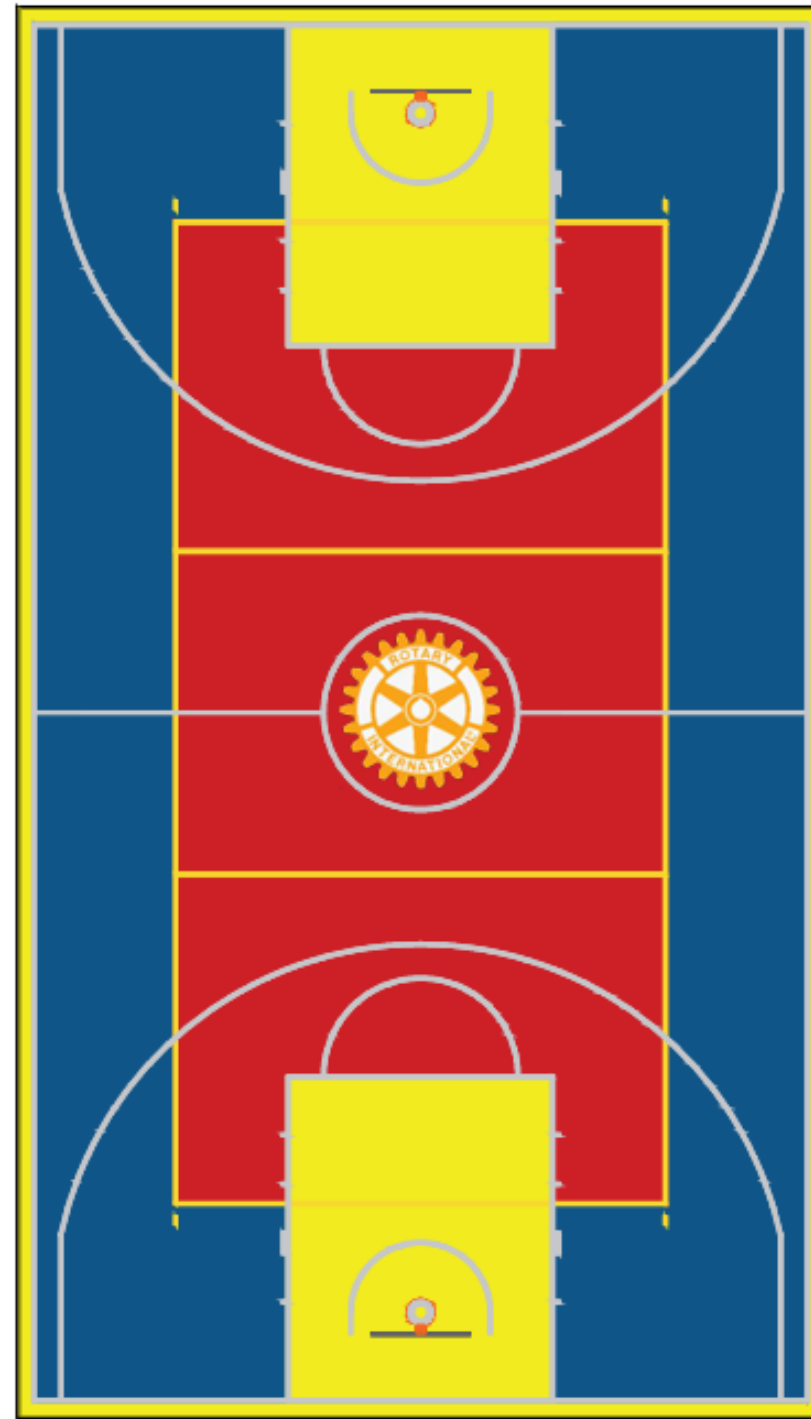
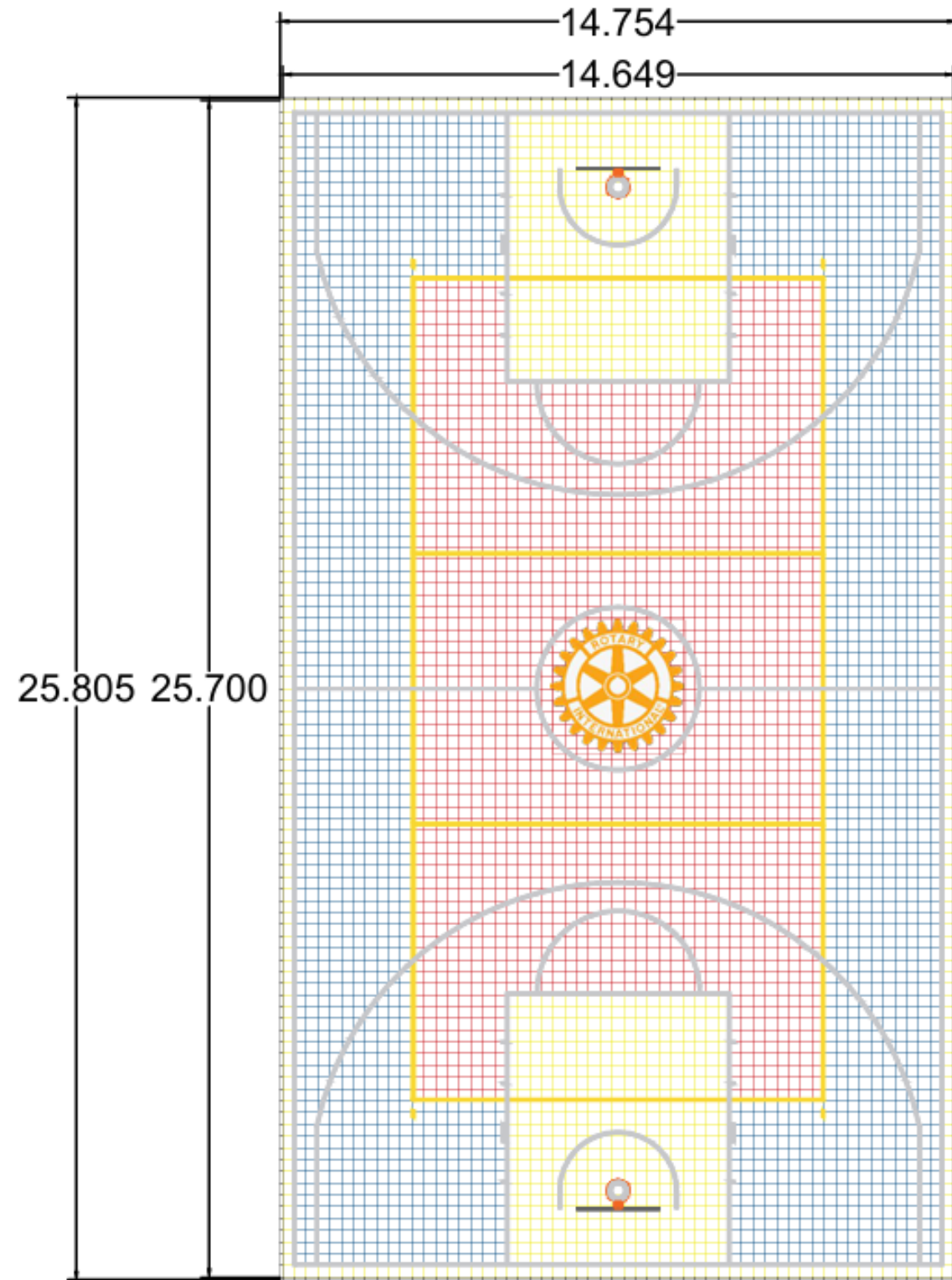
