The Challenge

- Chiapas: 72.2% poverty, 29% extreme poverty.
- High maternal and neonatal mortality (25–26 deaths in 2024).
- 18% of children suffer chronic malnutrition.
- 17% of teenage girls have been pregnant.
- Transfers of up to 6 hours for medical attention.
- Hospital lacks functional basic equipment.

The Solution

Equip the Community Basic Hospital with:

- Fetal and vital signs monitors.
- Safe hospital beds.
- Surgical aspirators and laryngoscopy sets.
- Vaccine coolers, examination lamps, and clinical scales.
- Colposcope and HeraFem® device for early cervical cancer detection.

Immediate Impact

- Safe care for 600 deliveries and 115 cesarean sections per year.
- Improvement in 1,800 prenatal and 1,000 gynecological consultations.
- Fast response to 7,500 emergencies annually.
- Guaranteed newborn vaccination.
